The Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges is the parent organization for thirty-five(35) community colleges in the states of Washington and Oregon\*. The NWAACC has a variety of administrative responsibilities including conference tournament management, eligibility, publications, rule enforcement and sports information.

The growth of the community colleges over the past decade has been impressive. The colleges in the Northwest are comprehensive in nature and provide a variety of academic and vocational offerings as well as many enrichment activities for their students. As our student athletes have transitioned into a work environment, many have provided testimony about the significant benefit and value that participation in community college athletics provided for them.

Student-athletes must be a full-time student enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits hours and maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA for any season of participation. Second year participants must have earned 36 credits and maintain a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA prior the season starts.

The Bellevue College men's soccer team has a winning tradition with ten NWAACC championships in the history books. The Bulldogs finished the 2010 campaign second in a very competitive West Region, but concluded their season in the NWAACC quarter-final tournament for a season record 12-5-2.
