**RESIDENCY FOR TUITION PURPOSES**

**HOUSE BILL 1079 (HB1079)**

Effective July 1, 2003, Washington state law changed the definition of "resident student." The law makes certain students eligible for resident student status – and eligible to pay resident tuition rates – when they attend public colleges and universities in this state. The law does not make these students eligible to receive need-based state or federal financial aid. To qualify for resident status, students must complete an affidavit/declaration/certification if they have met the following conditions:

- **Condition One:** Resided in Washington State for three (3) years immediately prior to receiving a high school diploma **and** completed the full senior year at a Washington high school **and** continuously resided in Washington State since earning the high school diploma
- . OR**
- **Condition Two:** Completed the equivalent of a high school diploma **and** resided in Washington State for the three (3) years immediately before receiving the equivalent diploma **and** continuously resided in Washington State since earning the equivalent diploma.

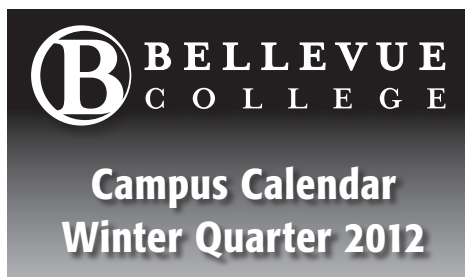
