


The following steps are provided as a guideline to view the satisfaction of required courses and identify courses remaining to satisfy your degree/program at Bellevue College.


Step 1: Go to Bellevue College Website www.bellevuecollege.edu

- Click on the [Online Services] link




Step 2: Go to the Degree Audit



Step 3: Click Main Campus Credit Classes

Unofficial Degree Audit

The Associate in Arts & Sciences (AAS-DTA) degree follows the Direct Transfer Agreement Guidelines. It is designed to prepare students who are interested in transferring to a participating Washington State four-year college or university. It requires 90 applicable college level quarter credits, with a cumulative GPA of 2.00 or above. A minimum of 30 credits of the applied 90 must be completed at BC. Only 100 and 200 level courses as specified are allowed.
